

# Perth Station closure

Friday, 17 August to last service on Sunday, 19 August



## Work from home. Take a break. Ride your bike. Carpool.

These are some tips to follow on Friday, 17 August when Perth Station closes from 10:30am until last service on Sunday, 19 August.

During the closure, the following lines will be disrupted:

- **Fremantle Line:** services will only run between West Leederville and Fremantle.
- **Midland Line:** services will only run between Claisebrook and Midland.
- **Armadale Line:** services will stop all stations between Claisebrook and Armadale.

- **Thornlie Line:** will close with train replacement buses from Cannington to Thornlie.

**There will be no impact to the Joondalup and Mandurah Lines.**

## Keeping passengers moving

A CAT-style service will loop from Claisebrook to West Leederville via Perth Station, with train replacement bus stops at:

1. **Claisebrook Station:** Fielder Street
2. **Perth Station** (continuing to West Leederville Station): Roe Street, west of William Street (see map)
3. **City West Station:** Roe Street

### 4. West Leederville Station

5. **City West Station:** Harbour Town, Wellington Street

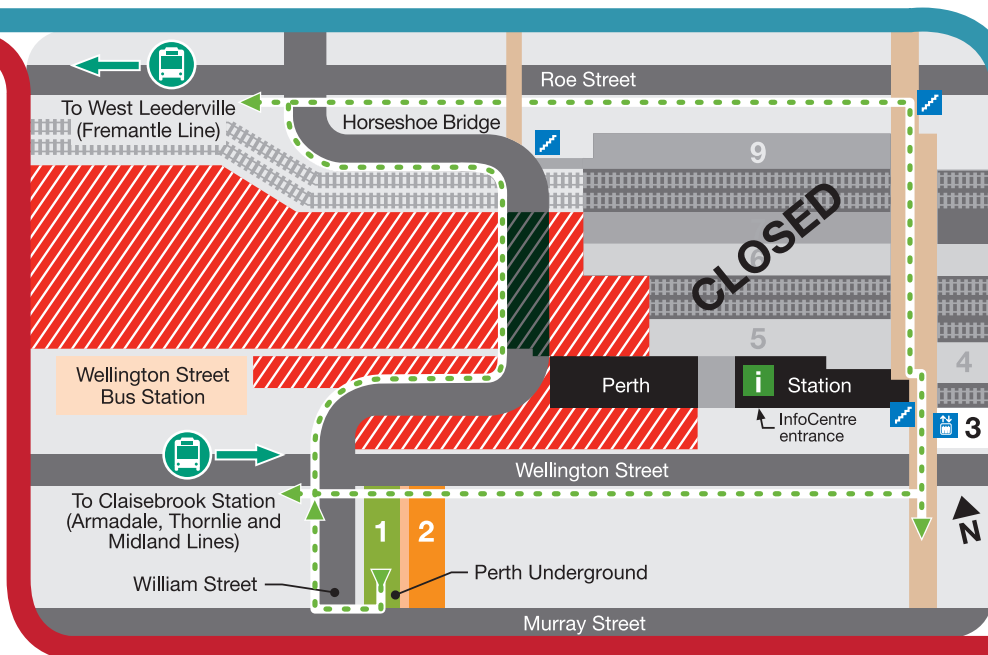
6. **Perth Station** (continuing to Claisebrook Station): Wellington Street, in front of Wellington Street Bus Station (see map)

The services will run every two minutes during the afternoon peak and will follow the train timetable frequency on the weekend.

Mclver Station passengers are encouraged to use Claisebrook Station as Mclver Station will be closed.

There will be additional disruptions from 8pm Sunday night affecting the Midland, Armadale, Fremantle, Joondalup and Mandurah Lines.

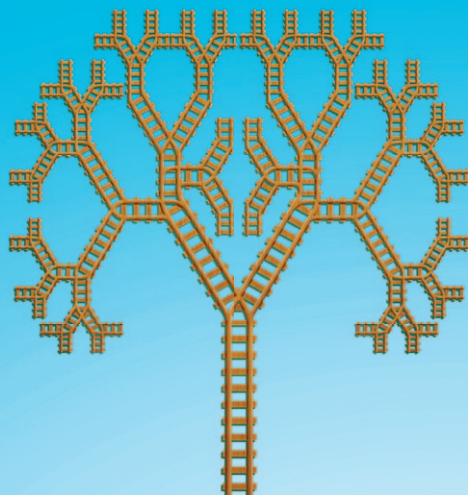
## Why?

As part of the Perth City Link work to sink the Fremantle Line, Perth Station is undergoing some major changes to provide faster, easier transfers and cater for future growth.

This disruption allows important platform changes to take place in Perth Station, which frees up space to build the new Fremantle Line tunnel, create a new platform and continue works on the pedestrian underpass.

# Specific impacts

## Fremantle Line passengers

Train services will operate between West Leederville Station and Fremantle Station. Passengers connecting to, or through, Perth Station can take the bus replacement from West Leederville to Perth Station (via Harbour Town for City West Station). The bus service will stop on Wellington Street in front of the Wellington Street Bus Station and continue on to Claisebrook Station.

## Midland Line passengers

Train services will operate between Claisebrook Station and Midland Station. Passengers connecting to, or through, Perth Station can take the bus replacement from Claisebrook to Perth Station. The bus service will stop on Roe Street, west of William Street and continue on to West Leederville Station. McIver Station will not have a bus replacement service. Passengers are asked to use Claisebrook Station.

## Armadale Line passengers

Train services stopping at all stations will operate between Claisebrook Station and Armadale Station.

Passengers connecting to, or through, Perth Station can take the bus replacement from Claisebrook to Perth Station. The bus service will stop on Roe Street, west of William Street and continue on to West Leederville Station. McIver Station will not have a bus replacement service. Passengers are asked to use Claisebrook Station.

## Thornlie Line passengers

A train replacement bus service will run from Cannington Station to Thornlie Station.

## AFL: Fremantle v Richmond

Fremantle Line trains will continue between Fremantle Station and West Leederville Station and the bus replacement service between West Leederville and Perth will increase in frequency before and after the game.

There will be express buses taking passengers straight to Perth or Claisebrook Stations after the game.

Passengers are encouraged to use Leederville Station or alternative Fremantle Line stations to get to and from the game.

## Accessibility

Passengers with accessibility difficulties should call 1800 800 022 to arrange for assistance at Perth Station, West Leederville and Claisebrook.

## Cyclists

The Roe Street principal shared pathway (PSP) west of William Street will be used as the temporary bus replacement stop during this work. Cyclists should slow down and take extra care in this area as passengers will be waiting for their train replacement bus services.

## Platform changes

From Monday, 20 August, Perth Station's platform layout will change to:

- **Fremantle Line:** Depart from Platform 5 and arrive on Platform 6.
- **Midland Line:** Arrive and depart from Platform 7.
- **Armadale Line:** Depart from Platform 6 and continue to arrive on Platform 5.

# Frequently asked questions

## Will the Mandurah Football special train be affected by the works?

Yes. The service will run from Mandurah to Perth Underground, where passengers are required to take a bus to West Leederville Station. Alternatively, passengers can stay on the train to Leederville and walk.

## Where are the bus replacement stops in the city?

The Roe Street stop, just west of William Street, is for passengers

heading to stations on the Fremantle Line. The Wellington Street stop, just outside the bus station, is for passengers heading to stations on the Midland or Armadale Line.

## Will any existing bus routes be altered to go direct to the city?

No. The train replacement buses will have no impact on existing bus routes.

## Why does this work require such a big shutdown?

To build the next section of the tunnel, part of the Fremantle Line needs

to be relocated to the other side of the site. Due to the extensive track, overhead wiring and signalling works involved, a 64-hour shutdown of Perth Station is required.

## What's the best way to get home from work on Friday, 17 August?

Though bus replacements services will help passengers get home, CBD workers are encouraged to carpool, ride to work, or work from home.
