East Perth Station Upgrade: Pedestrian footbridge closure and out-of-hours work from 30 June to 30 July 2017.

Work commenced in late-2016 to upgrade East Perth Station as part of the Perth Stadium Transport Infrastructure project and the Public Transport Authority's (PTA) program of Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) improvements.

The upgrade of the station will provide the infrastructure needed to cater for the larger crowds expected on Perth Stadium event days, as well as making the station DDA compliant.

Pedestrian Footbridge Closure

To allow the station's new concourse to be safely craned into position, the pedestrian footbridge crossing the tracks at East Perth Station will now close on from 8.30pm to 5.30am on Sunday 2 and Monday 3 July 2017.

During this time, the Midland Line will be closed and train replacement buses will operate from East Parade. As such, passengers travelling to or from the west side of the tracks at East Perth Station (where the Public Transport Centre is located), are strongly encouraged to avoid East Perth and use either Claisebrook or Mt Lawley stations. Alternatively, local passengers can also access Transperth services via Routes 41, 42, 48 and 55 from Lord Street, East Perth.

Local community members who wish to cross the tracks can do so at either the Lord Street underpass or the Graham Farmer Freeway pathway.

Out-of-hours works

For residents close to the work site, please be advised that over the next month, in addition to the concourse installation mentioned above, the following out-of-hours work is required:

- **Friday 30 June to Monday 3 July:** 7pm Friday to 5am Monday inclusive.
- **Monday 3 to Friday 7 July:** 7pm to 7am each night.
- **Sunday 9 to Monday 10 July:** 7am Sunday to 5am Monday inclusive.
- **Friday 21 to Monday 24 July:** 8pm Friday to 5am Monday inclusive.
- **Monday 24 to Friday 28 July:** 7pm to 7am each night.
- **Friday 28 to Monday 31 July:** 8pm Friday to 4am Monday inclusive.

Should train services be impacted, replacement buses will operate from East Parade. For service disruption information please visit transperth.wa.gov.au.

Work is required to take place during these hours to prevent excessive disruption to Midland Line services and ensure the safety of our passengers and the general public.

The works will involve:

- Building access scaffolding;
- Completing earth works;
- Upgrading the fire services on the Indian Pacific platform;
- Loading material into the rail reserve;
- Installing steel on the East Perth platform;
- Installing concourse screens, roofing, glazing and ceilings; and
- Conducting signal testing.

All work will follow an approved Noise Management Plan, however some noise and disturbance is unavoidable. A noise monitor is set up within the construction area to monitor noise levels. We apologise for these disruptions and any inconvenience they may cause.

Standard construction hours are 7am to 7pm, Monday to Saturday. During out-of-hours works if you feel there is excessive noise please contact the **Site Supervisor** directly on **0428 358 569**. This allows them to immediately review the source of the noise and if possible, put mitigation measures in place.
