Why is this happening?

Sinking the Fremantle Line allows a number of upgrades to happen at Perth Station. By closing Platform 9, space becomes available to:

- Build the new tunnel, including where it declines and inclines from the Horseshoe Bridge.
- Create Platform 8/9 by installing new tracks on the Roe Street side of Platform 9 and under the Barrack Street Bridge.
- Build the pedestrian underpass from Platform 7 to Platform 8/9.




Overpass

As part of the Perth City Link work to sink the Fremantle Line, Perth Station is undergoing some major changes to provide faster, easier transfers and cater for future growth.

We're growing to keep you going

Perth Station closure

From 10.30am on Friday, 17 August to 8pm on Sunday, 19 August.

- Fremantle Line: services will run between West Leederville and Fremantle.
- Midland Line: services will run between Claisebrook and Midland.
- Armadale Line: services will stop all stations between Claisebrook and Armadale.
- Thornlie Line: will close with train replacement buses from Cannington to Thornlie.

No impact to Joondalup and Mandurah lines.


A CAT-style service will loop from Claisebrook to West Leederville via Perth Station.

From 8pm to last service on Sunday, 19 August.

There will be additional disruptions affecting the **Fremantle, Midland, Armadale, Joondalup** and **Mandurah** lines.

Train replacement bus services will be available.

Platform changes

From Monday, 20 August, the following changes will be in place at Perth Station:

- Fremantle Line: depart from Platform 5 and arrive on Platform 6. Passengers connecting through to the Midland Line must leave the train and go to Platform 7.
- **Midland Line:** arrive and depart from Platform 7. Passengers connecting through to the Fremantle Line must leave the train and go to Platform 5.
- Armadale Line: depart from Platform 6 and continue to arrive on Platform 5. Armadale Line will connect through to the Fremantle Line.
- Platform 9: closed.
- Thornlie Line: no change.
- Mandurah Line: no change.
- Joondalup Line: no change.

These changes will be in place for just over a year.

What this means

With Platform 9 closed, the direct Roe Street access into Perth Station also closes. The new layout change will also mean changes to train and bus timetables.
